YOU'RE INVITED TO A COMMUNITY OPEN HOUSE

We invite you to attend our community open house to learn more about Hydro One's important upgrades to an underground transmission cable that serves Toronto's downtown core. Originally built in the 1950s, the cable is reaching its end of life and must be replaced to ensure that we continue to provide reliable power to the city's most crucial institutions, including hospitals, schools, and businesses.

This project is subject to the Class Environmental Assessment (EA) for Minor Transmission Facilities (Hydro One, 2016), in accordance with the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*. This guides Hydro One's planning process to identify potential project effects and opportunities for mitigation. In Spring 2018, we initiated our Class EA and our team is continuing to evaluate a number of alternative routes for installing the new cable and two construction methods, as shown on the reverse map.

Gathering input from residents, businesses and interest groups is an important part of our evaluation process and we want to hear from you. We encourage you to drop in to one of our upcoming open houses to learn more about the proposed work in your community:

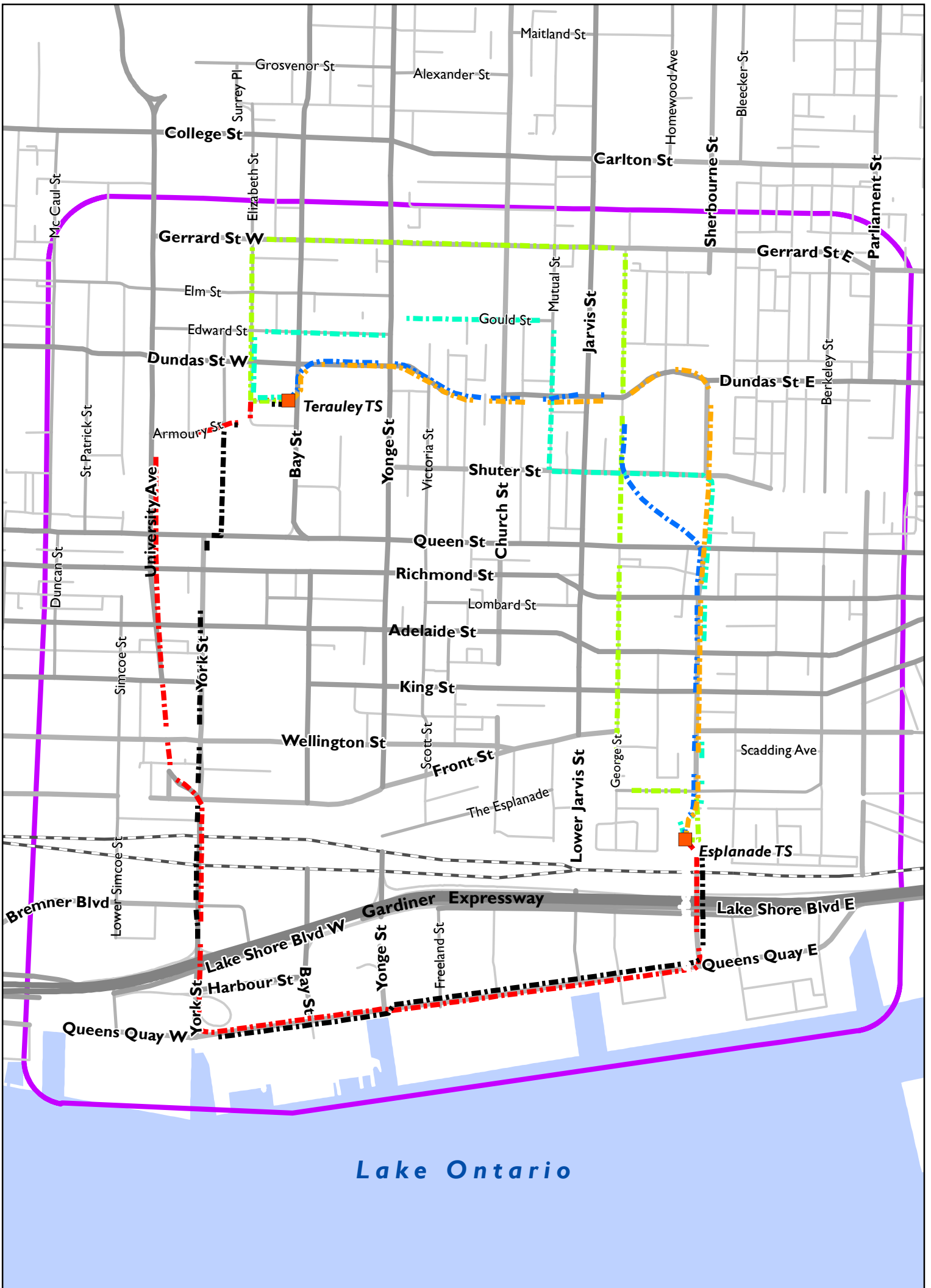
