



Hydro One FNMI Award

Hydro One and its predecessor companies have been maintaining relationships with First Nations and Métis communities for many years. Hydro One is also committed to increasing the representation of First Nations, Métis and Inuit (FNMI) employees by encouraging and rewarding college and university students to consider careers within the electricity industry. In 2011, Hydro One established the Hydro One FNMI Award – an educational scholarship that supports FNMI students. The academic award will be granted annually to two FNMI students (where possible, one male and one female) studying power industry related disciplines at a recognized Ontario university or community college. The recipients will also be offered a developmental work term at Hydro One.

Award criteria

Two awards are available annually to First Nations/Métis/Inuit students attending an Ontario university or college.

The award value is \$5000 for a university recipient or \$3000 for a college recipient.

The awards are given to a FNMI male and a FNMI female student who has completed a minimum of one year in an undergraduate program in one of the following areas: **Electrical, Computer, Mechanical, Civil or Environmental Engineering/Technology, Engineering Science, Forestry or Business.**

All applicants should:

- Be in good academic standing
- Have demonstrated leadership skills with involvement in extra-curricular activities within the community or campus
- Not be receiving more than one other award of equal or greater value during application
- Be legally eligible to work in Canada upon graduation.

How to apply

The award candidate applies to Hydro One on the application form found in the Student Awards Office or Aboriginal Student Service office of their campus or printed from the Hydro One website at www.hydroone.com/careers/ and then choosing Awards and Scholarships.

Applicants **must include** a copy of their unofficial transcripts and updated resume along with their application form.

Where to apply and deadline

The application deadline is **December 31 of any given year.**

Selecting the winners

Following the application deadline (December 31) the applications are reviewed by Hydro One's First Nations and Métis Relations group in conjunction with Hydro One Human Resources. The top candidates are short-listed for an interview.

The interview candidates are then ranked based on their interview scores and the top male and top female candidates are chosen as the winners.

Awards luncheon

Hydro One will arrange an awards luncheon for the award winners and immediate family where the monetary award will be presented.

Work term with Hydro One

In addition to the cash award, the winners are given an opportunity to obtain a paid position performing career-related work with Hydro One.

Hydro One will contact the award winners to arrange this work term.
