## **Hydro One grants \$7,100 to Algona Wilberforce Township as part of the PowerPlay Program, which supports recreational facilities**

**December 21, 2009** - Hydro One has provided a \$7,100 PowerPlay grant to Algona Wilberforce Township in support of new lighting for the community's ice rink. The Rankin Cultural and Recreational Centre provides a wide range of recreational programs in the Township.

Hydro One helps fund a variety of projects involving youth and recreation activities in the communities served by Hydro One. Through the PowerPlay Program, the Company has provided grants of \$5,000 to \$25,000 to help support nearly 200 community recreational projects.

"We believe it is important to continue to invest in Hydro One communities through our PowerPlay Grants Program," said Laura Formosa, President and CEO, Hydro One. "Hydro One's support for skating rinks, baseball diamonds, and other recreational infrastructure recognizes that such recreational facilities are vital to the health and well-being of our children and contribute to the success of communities."

"The contribution from Hydro One will enable us to improve the lighting of our outdoor rink and reduce our power consumption. The savings will be used for other sports activities at the Centre," said Peter Sauk, President of the Rankin Cultural and Recreational Centre.

The PowerPlay Program is open to municipalities and registered charities in Hydro One-served communities. The program offers grants up to \$25,000 for new facilities and renovation of existing facilities that are open and accessible to the community at large. Additional funding may be available where energy efficiency measures are incorporated into the project. The next application deadline is January 31, 2010.
