## **Hydro One grants \$10,000 to the City of Woodstock as part of the PowerPlay Program, which supports recreational facilities**

**December 21, 2009** - Hydro One has provided a \$10,000 PowerPlay grant to the City of Woodstock in support of its recreational facilities. The funds will help upgrade a playground and provide an indoor soccer pitch in the Cowan Park Project. Half of the funds will be in support of play facilities for the Woodstock Soccer Association.

Hydro One helps fund a variety of projects involving youth and recreation activities in the communities served by Hydro One. Through the PowerPlay Program, the Company has provided grants of \$5,000 to \$25,000 to help support nearly 200 community recreational projects.

The PowerPlay Program is open to municipalities and registered charities in Hydro One-served communities. The program offers grants up to \$25,000 for new facilities and renovation of existing facilities that are open and accessible to the community at large. Additional funding may be available where energy efficiency measures are incorporated into the project. The next application deadline is January 31, 2010.
