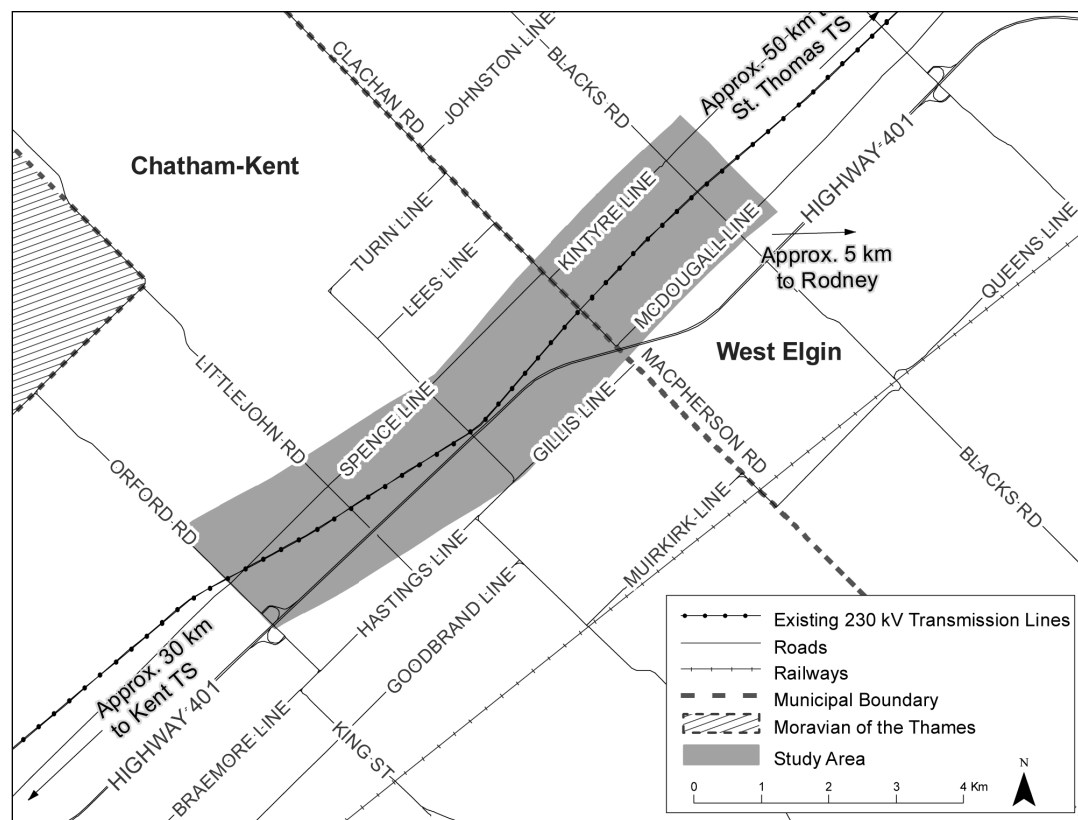


You are invited to our Public Information Centre

West Elgin and Chatham-Kent Transformer Station



Hydro One Networks (Hydro One) is proposing to build a new transformer station in the Chatham-Kent and West Elgin area. This area is currently supplied electricity from Hydro One's Kent Transformer Station (TS) and St. Thomas TS. Thomas TS is reaching the end-of-life, and Kent TS is at capacity, a new transformer station is therefore needed to continue to maintain reliable supply to customers.

The project study area extends north east of Oxford Road, to Blacks Road, between Spence Line and Gillis Line, near the village of Rodney (see map). Hydro One will identify a number of potential sites for the new station within this area. The proposed station would be connected to the existing 230 kV transmission line that is located north of Highway 401.

The project is subject to provincial *Environmental Assessment (EA) Act* approval in accordance with the *Class EA for Minor Transmission Facilities*. Hydro One is seeking public input on alternative sites for the new transformer station.
