Notice of Completion of Class Environmental Assessment

Enfield Transformer Station (formerly Oshawa/Clarington)

Hydro One Networks Inc. has selected a preferred site (Site 1c) for a new transformer station in the Municipality of Clarington to meet the growing demand for electricity in Durham Region. The proposed station will be located on a Hydro One owned property, north of Concession Road 7 and east of the unopened Townline Rd. allowance as shown on the map.

Background

At the second Public Information Centre on October 24th, 2006, two alternative sites (1a and 2) were presented. Site 1a, located on Hydro One property, was selected as the preferred site. Based on a number of issues raised by local residents, Hydro One undertook a subsequent investigation of potential sites on its property that sought to address these community concerns. Hydro One identified two additional sites (1b and 1c) and evaluated and compared these with the original alternatives. Following a detailed analysis of environmental, technical and socio-economic criteria, which included agency and public consultation, Site 1c was selected as the preferred site.

Provincial and municipal government agencies and local community members were consulted on the site evaluation process and their comments have been incorporated into the environmental assessment (EA) process.

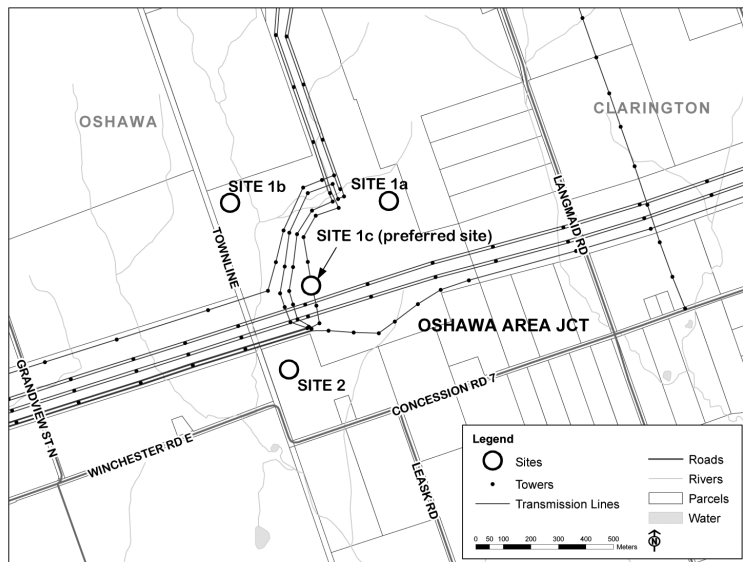
