IN THE MATTER OF the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, S.O.1998,
c.15 (Schedule B);

AND IN THE MATTER OF an Application by Hydro One Networks Inc.,
for an Order or Orders made pursuant to section 78 of the *Ontario
Energy Board Act, 1998* approving just and reasonable rates and other
charges for the distribution of electricity, in the service areas served by
Hydro One Distribution, and in the service areas formerly served by
Orillia Power Distribution Corporation, Peterborough Distribution Inc.
and Chapleau Public Utilities Commission, to be effective January 1,
2027.

1. The Applicant, Hydro One Networks Inc. (Hydro One), is an Ontario corporation with its head office in Toronto, Ontario. Hydro One is licensed by the Ontario Energy Board (the OEB or the Board), under licence number ED-2003-0043, to distribute electricity and carry on the business of owning and operating distribution facilities in Ontario in the areas specified in its licence.
2. The Hydro One service areas formerly served by Orillia Power Distribution Corporation (OPDC) and Peterborough Distribution Inc. (PDI) are herein referred to as Orillia Rate Zone (RZ) and Peterborough RZ (or the Acquired Utilities), and former Chapleau Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) is referred to as Chapleau herein.
3. This is the consolidated annual application filed by Hydro One seeking approval of the 2027 distribution rates and charges for Hydro One Distribution (inclusive of Chapleau¹), Orillia RZ and Peterborough RZ (the Application).

- 1 4. For Hydro One Distribution, the Application for 2027 distribution rates is the fourth
2 annual rate application filed under the Custom Revenue Cap Index (RCI) framework
3 approved in its 2023 to 2027 Custom Incentive Rate-setting (Custom IR) Rebasing
4 Application since 2023 rebasing.²
5
- 6 5. The Orillia and Peterborough RZs both enter the seventh year of their ten-year
7 deferred rebasing period, which is set to expire on August 31, 2030 and July 31, 2030
8 respectively. As a result, this is the second Incentive Rate-setting Mechanism (IRM)
9 application for the Orillia RZ and Peterborough RZ whose distribution rates are
10 escalated by the OEB's Price Cap Incentive Rate-setting (Price Cap IR) adjustment
11 mechanism.
12
- 13 6. Hydro One hereby applies to the OEB for an Order approving:
14
 - 15 a) Electricity distribution rates and charges for Hydro One Distribution, Orillia RZ and
16 Peterborough RZ to be effective on January 1, 2027;
 - 17 b) An adjustment to the Retail Transmission Service Rates (RTSR) effective for
18 January 1, 2027;
 - 19 c) The disposition of the 2027 Lost Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (LRAM)
20 Eligible amounts that were previously approved in EB-2022-0040³ for the Orillia
21 and Peterborough RZs;
 - 22 d) Deferral of Hydro One Networks' 2025 Group 1 DVA balances to the 2028-2032
23 Custom IR application; and deferral of Orillia and Peterborough RZ's 2025 Group
24 1 DVA balances to its 2028 IRM application; and
 - 25 e) Other items or amounts that may be requested by Hydro One in the course of this
26 proceeding, and as may be granted by the OEB.

1 7. Approval of this Application will result in the following 2027 bill impacts:

2
3 **a) Hydro One Distribution** – an increase in the total bill of 4.0% or \$5.91 per month
4 for a typical Hydro One medium density residential (R1) customer consuming 750
5 kWh monthly (with DRP)⁴ and an increase in total bill of 4.9% or \$22.48 per month
6 for a typical Hydro One General Service Energy less than 50 kW (GSe < 50 kW)
7 customer consuming 2,000 kWh monthly.

8
9 **b) Orillia RZ** – an increase in the total bill of 4.9% or \$6.42 per month for a typical
10 residential customer consuming 750 kWh monthly and an increase in total bill of
11 4.9% or \$16.71 per month for a typical General Service Energy less than 50 kW
12 (GSe < 50 kW) customer consuming 2,000 kWh monthly.

13
14 **c) Peterborough RZ** – an increase in the total bill of 3.1% or \$3.90 per month for a
15 typical residential customer consuming 750 kWh monthly and an increase in total
16 bill of 3.0% or \$9.88 per month for a typical General Service Energy less than 50
17 kW (GSe < 50 kW) customer consuming 2,000 kWh monthly.

18
19 8. More information regarding the monthly bill impacts can be found in Exhibit A-06-01.

20
21 9. In preparing this Application, Hydro One has been guided by the OEB's 2026 Filing
22 Requirements for Electricity Distribution Rate Applications and the Handbook for
23 Utility Rate Applications (the Filing Requirements).

24
25 10. The written evidence filed with the OEB may be amended from time to time prior to
26 the OEB's final decision on the Application.

All Hydro One Distribution, Orillia RZ and Peterborough RZ customers will be affected by this Application due to an update to the base revenue requirement, RTSRs, and the update to the LRAM rate riders for Orillia and Peterborough RZs, well as province-wide updates to the specific charge for access to power poles (telecom) and Retail Service Charges.

13. Hydro One requests, in accordance with sections 6(4) and 21(4)(b) of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, that this Application be disposed of without a hearing and hereby provides its consent to same. Hydro One submits that in accordance with the requirements of section 21(4)(b) of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, no person will be adversely affected in a material way by the outcome of this proceeding.

PROPOSED EFFECTIVE DATE

14. Hydro One requests that the OEB's Rate Orders be effective January 1, 2027. In order to address the possibility that the requested Rate Order cannot be made effective by that time, Hydro One requests an interim Rate Order making its current distribution rates and charges effective on an interim basis as of January 1, 2027, and approval to recover any differences between the interim rates and final rates effective January 1, 2027, based on the OEB's Decision and Order herein.

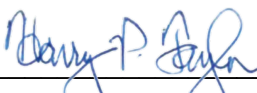

SUMMARY OF OEB DIRECTIVES AND COMPLIANCE WITH PRIOR OEB DECISIONS

This Exhibit provides a summary of directives and undertakings from Hydro One's past proceedings and provides a status update or explains the steps Hydro One has taken to address the OEB's direction as part of this Application for Hydro One Distribution and Orillia and Peterborough RZs.

Hydro One Distribution

Filing Modified Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform in EB-2025-0030 Decision

In the EB-2025-0030 Decision, the OEB approved disposition of the 2023 and 2024 balances related to Accounts 1588 and 1589 on an interim basis and directed Hydro One to file the modified Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform (Workform) with a breakdown of separate reconciling items for any billing adjustments, IESO settlement adjustments, or other adjustments in the 2027 Annual Update Application.¹ This is addressed in Exhibit A-04-06 of this Application.

Orillia and Peterborough RZs

Price Cap Incentive Rate-setting (IR) Adjustment from years 6 to 10 of deferred rebasing period (EB-2018-0270/EB-2018-0242)

In accordance with the OEB's Decision and Order on Hydro One Network Inc.'s mergers, acquisitions, amalgamations and divestitures (MAADs) applications for the OPDC service area and PDI service area, Hydro One Networks Inc. shall apply for electricity rates for customers using the OEB's Price Cap Incentive Rate-setting (Price Cap IR) adjustment mechanism for years six to ten of the deferred rebasing period.² Hydro One has responded to this direction in Exhibit A-04-02 of this Application.

1 Lost Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (LRAM) Variance Account – Disposition of LRAM-
2 Eligible Amounts for 2027

3 In the 2023 IRM Application in EB-2022-0040, the OEB approved the LRAM-eligible
4 amounts for 2023-2029 arising from persisting savings of completed CDM programs for
5 the Orillia and Peterborough RZs. The OEB directed that these amounts be adjusted
6 mechanistically by the approved inflation minus X factor applicable to IRM applications in
7 effect for a given year and recovered through a rate rider in the corresponding rate year.³
8 The OEB inflation factor applied in the I-X factor escalation corresponds with the OEB
9 approved inflation factor in effect for a given year. In the case of Orillia and Peterborough
10 RZs, the stretch factor applied in the I-X escalation for prospective disposition of LRAM-
11 eligible amounts is consistent with the stretch factor applied in each of the rate zone's
12 Price Cap IR adjustment.

13
14 Accordingly, Hydro One is seeking disposition of the 2027 LRAM-eligible amounts
15 escalated by the OEB-approved inflation factor for 2027 rates in this Application and is
16 requesting these amounts to be recovered over a 1-year period. For additional information,
17 refer to Exhibit A-05-01.

18
19 The OEB's 2027 IRM Checklist has been completed and is provided in Exhibit A-03-01,
20 Attachment 1.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

1.0 MANAGER'S SUMMARY

Hydro One is applying for distribution rates and other charges, effective January 1, 2027, in this annual update application (the Application). This Application has been prepared in accordance with the OEB's latest Filing Requirements for Electricity Distribution Rate Applications and the Handbook for Utility Rate Applications (the Filing Requirements).

This Application affects approximately 1.5 million distribution customers. Hydro One serves approximately 1.5 million distribution customers, primarily in the rural and remote areas of Ontario. The Orillia RZ serves approximately 15,000 mostly residential and commercial electricity customers in the City of Orillia. The Peterborough RZ serves approximately 37,000 mostly residential and commercial electricity customers in the City of Peterborough, the Town of Norwood, and the Village of Lakefield. Hydro One's most recent acquisition of Chapleau served approximately 1,200 customers in the Township the Chapleau.

Hydro One has filed custom models and spreadsheets for Hydro One Distribution as its distribution rates are derived based on a revenue cap index. Consistent with the past filings of Hydro One's Annual Update applications and 2023-2027 Custom IR Application, the custom spreadsheets included with this Application are substantively the same as those included in the OEB's IRM Rate Generator model (where only applicable tabs were filled out and provided as individual attachments). Hydro One has completed the OEB's IRM Rate Generator Model for the Orillia and Peterborough RZs.

Additionally, pursuant to the OEB's 2024 Decision and Rate Order for Hydro One (EB-2023-0030 and EB-2023-0059), Hydro One was approved to file a Consolidated GA Analysis Workform (now, the Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform) for all RZs.

1 **Hydro One Distribution**

2 In Hydro One's 2023 to 2027 Custom IR application in EB-2021-0110, it was approved to
3 escalate the distribution revenue requirement for the years 2024 through to 2027 inclusive,
4 using an approved RCI formula as further described in Exhibit A-04-02.¹

5
6 **Orillia and Peterborough RZs**

7 On April 30, 2020, the OEB approved the following two Mergers, Acquisitions,
8 Amalgamations and Divestitures (MAADs) applications filed by Hydro One Inc. (HOI),
9 (Hydro One's parent company):

- 10 a. **Orillia Power Distribution Corporation (OPDC)** – The OEB approved the
11 MAADs application² to purchase all the issued and outstanding shares of OPDC;
12 and
13 b. **Peterborough Distribution Inc. (PDI)** – The OEB approved the MAADs
14 application³ to purchase the distribution system of the amalgamated corporation
15 of PDI and Peterborough Utilities Services Inc., and to subsequently transfer the
16 assets and liabilities of the electricity businesses to Hydro One.

17
18 The integration of OPDC and PDI into Hydro One's distribution system was completed on
19 June 1, 2021. Customers of the former OPDC and PDI service areas are currently on a
20 ten-year deferred rebasing period as approved by the OEB, which is set to expire on
21 August 31, 2030, and July 31, 2030, respectively.

22
23 For years six to ten of the deferred rebasing period, the OEB's Price Cap IR adjustment
24 mechanism will apply. For the same period, Hydro One will record annually the guaranteed
25 Earnings Sharing Mechanism (ESM) savings in its OEB-approved deferral account for

disposition to customers at the end of the deferred rebasing period for the Orillia and Peterborough RZs.^{4, 5}

Harmonization of Chapleau Public Utilities Corporation (CPUC) Customers

On April 18, 2024, the OEB approved the sale of CPUC's distribution system assets to Hydro One (EB-2023-0328). The transaction closed on August 1, 2024 and, as part of the acquisition agreement, the distribution customers of Chapleau have moved to corresponding Hydro One rate classes.⁶

2.0 SUMMARY OF RATE ADJUSTMENTS BY RATE ZONE

Hydro One Distribution

Hydro One is seeking OEB approval of the following items for Hydro One Distribution:

- a. Electricity distribution rates effective on January 1, 2027 where the revenue requirement for Hydro One Distribution is determined formulaically using the Custom IR methodology approved in EB-2021-0110;
- b. Updated Retail Transmission Service Rates (RTSR) effective on January 1, 2027; and
- c. Deferral of the 2025 Group 1 DVA balances to Hydro One Networks' 2028-2032 Custom IR application.

Orillia RZ

Hydro One is seeking OEB approval of the following items for the Orillia RZ:

- a. Electricity distribution rates effective on January 1, 2027 that are escalated by the Price Cap IR adjustment mechanism;
- b. Updated RTSR effective on January 1, 2027;
- c. Deferral of the 2025 Group 1 DVA balances to its 2028 IRM application; and

- d. Disposition of the 2027 LRAM Eligible amounts that were previously approved in EB-2022-0040 by means of rate riders effective over a 12-month period beginning on January 1, 2027.

Peterborough RZ

Hydro One is seeking OEB approval of the following items for the Peterborough RZ:

- a. Electricity distribution rates effective on January 1, 2027 that are escalated by the Price Cap IR adjustment mechanism;
- b. Updated RTSR, effective on January 1, 2027;
- c. Deferral of the 2025 Group 1 DVA balances to its 2028 IRM Application; and
- d. Disposition of the 2027 LRAM Eligible amounts that were previously approved in EB-2022-0040 by means of rate riders effective over a 12-month period beginning on January 1, 2027.

ANNUAL RATE ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM

Hydro One Distribution

In the OEB's Decision on Settlement Proposal and Order on Rates, Revenue Requirement and Charge Determinants (the Decision and Order) for Hydro One's Custom IR Application (EB-2021-0110), the OEB approved the Custom IR methodology for adjusting Hydro One's distribution revenue requirement for the years 2024 to 2027, inclusive.¹

The approved formula for the Custom IR for the test year t+1 is equal to the revenue in year t inflated by the Revenue Cap Index (RCI) set out below as:

$$RCI = I - X + C$$

Where:

"I" is the Inflation Factor, based on the distribution industry specific weighted two-factor input price index;

"X" is the Productivity Factor, which includes a Stretch Factor; and

"C" is the Custom Capital Factor, based on the incremental revenue necessary to support Hydro One's Distribution System Plan, beyond the amount of revenue recovered in rates.

In accordance with the OEB's Decision and Order for Hydro One's Custom IR Application (EB-2021-0110), the Inflation Factor and the Custom Capital Factor will be updated annually. On June 11, 2026, the OEB released the Inflation Factor to be used by electricity distributors for 2027 rate applications beginning January 1, 2027. This Application reflects the 3.0% Inflation Factor calculated by the OEB for electricity distributors.² Consistent with the OEB's Decision and Order in EB-2021-0110, the Productivity Factor of 0.45% will not be updated over the 2024 to 2027 period.³

As shown above, the 2027 distribution service revenue requirement (or total revenue requirement) of \$2,073.4M has been determined formulaically, using the Custom IR methodology approved in EB-2021-0110. After deducting for external revenues as approved in EB-2021-0110,⁵ it results in a proposed 2027 base revenue requirement of \$2,029.2M as outlined in Table 4 below.

1 **Orillia and Peterborough RZ**

2 As part of Hydro One's MAAD applications for OPDC in EB-2018-0270, and PDI in EB-
3 2018-0242, the OEB approved a ten-year deferred rebasing period.⁶

4
5 During years one to five of the deferred rebasing period, all base distribution delivery rates
6 for the Orillia RZ and Peterborough RZ were frozen, with a 1% reduction in base
7 distribution delivery rates for residential, general service and large use customers. For
8 years six to ten of the deferred rebasing period, the OEB's Price Cap IR adjustment
9 mechanism will apply to the last approved rates. As such, the second year of the Price
10 Cap IR adjustment mechanism will take effect starting January 1, 2027 for the Orillia and
11 Peterborough RZs.

COST ALLOCATION AND RATE DESIGN

Hydro One Distribution

1.0 COST ALLOCATION

In accordance with the OEB's Decision and Order (EB-2021-0110), Hydro One has not updated the cost allocation model over the term of the plan. The determination of the 2027 costs and rates revenue requirement by rate class uses the approved methodology consistent with the OEB's Decision and Order in EB-2021-0110.

2.0 RATE DESIGN

2.1 FIXED AND VOLUMETRIC RATES

The calculation of the 2027 fixed and volumetric rates taking into account the approved 2027 forecast number of customers and load, consistent with the OEB-approved methodology, is provided in Exhibit A-04-03, Attachment 01. The derivation of fixed to volumetric revenue splits for residential and non-residential rate classes are described below.

a) Residential Rate Classes

The transition to all-fixed distribution rates is now complete for all residential rate classes. However, as approved by the OEB in EB-2020-0246,¹ and further confirmed in EB-2021-0110),² the R2 rate class will continue to have a declining volumetric rate until 2032, consistent with the bill-impact mitigation phase-in established for Seasonal-R2 customers.

b) Non-Residential Rate Classes

Fixed and volumetric distribution charges for non-residential rate classes have been calculated using the methodology approved by the OEB in EB-2021-0110.3 Detailed derivation of distribution rates is shown in Exhibit A-04-03, Attachment 01.

2.2 REVENUE-TO-COST RATIOS

Consistent with the Decision and Order in EB-2021-0110, Hydro One has not performed any revenue-to-cost ratio adjustments for the 2027 rate year.⁴

2.3 HOPPER FOUNDRY AND TRANSFORMER COST ALLOWANCE RATE ADDERS

The proposed 2027 Hopper Foundry rate adder reflects the proposed 2027 General Service Demand rates. The forecast lost revenue related to Hopper Foundry is \$109,930 and results in a rate adder of \$0.0159 per kW. This adder is included in the volumetric rate shown on the 2027 tariff schedule for the General Service demand (GSd) rate class.

As per the Decision and Order in EB-2021-0110, the Customer Supplied Transformer Allowance (CSTA) rate adders for GSd, UGd, DGen, AUGd, and AGSd rate classes will remain unchanged at their currently approved values (2023).⁵

**RETAIL TRANSMISSION SERVICE RATES (RTSRS) AND SUB
TRANSMISSION (ST) RATES**

Hydro One Distribution

1.0 RETAIL TRANSMISSION SERVICE RATES (RTSRS)

The current 2026 RTSRs are based on the 2026 Preliminary Uniform Transmission Rates (UTRs),¹ which were the transmission rates in place at the time Hydro One's previous Application was approved.

Hydro One proposes to adjust the RTSRs to reflect the updated costs to Hydro One for transmission services for 2027 RTSRs based on the currently approved UTRs.² Hydro One's RTSR calculations reflect the OEB's RTSR Guidelines issued on March 31, 2025.

The current and proposed RTSRs for Hydro One Distribution are provided in Table 1 below. The calculation of the 2027 RTSRs is provided in Exhibit A-04-04, Attachment 1.

2.0 SUB TRANSMISSION (ST) RATES

RTSRs are proposed to be updated effective January 1, 2027. As a result, the proposed 2027 HVDS-High charge, HVDS-Low charge, and the Common ST Line charge have been adjusted to reflect the proposed 2027 ST RTSR for Transformation Connection. The calculation of 2027 ST rates are detailed in Exhibit A-04-04, Attachment 2.

Hydro One will update the 2027 RTSRs, ST rates (namely HVDS-High; HVDS-Low; and Common ST Line), and corresponding bill impacts in the event that the 2027 Preliminary UTRs are issued by the OEB prior to issuing the final rate order in this Application. An updated proposed 2027 tariff schedule will also be provided at that time.

Orillia and Peterborough RZs

3.0 RETAIL TRANSMISSION SERVICE RATES (RTSRs)

The proposed 2027 RTSRs in this Application are determined using the OEB's 2027 IRM Model, (Tab 10. RTSR Current Rates) through (Tab 15. RTSR Rates to Forecast) of the IRM Models for respective rate zones in Exhibit A-04-05, Attachment 4 (Orillia RZ) and Exhibit A-04-05, Attachment 5 (Peterborough RZ), which reflect the current UTRs (effective January 1, 2026) and Hydro One's RTSR for its ST class (approved for January 1, 2026), as well as the approved loss factors.

Hydro One will update the transmission rates in (Tab 11. RTSR – UTRs & Sub-Tx) of the IRM Models in the event that 2027 Preliminary UTRs are approved by the OEB prior to issuing the final rate order in this Application. The resulting updated 2027 RTSRs will be provided to the OEB in revised 2027 IRM Models, tariff schedules and bill impacts.

Following OPDC and PDI's integration with Hydro One, Hydro One's transmission charges have been settled on an overall basis, and consequently separate transmission demand details by rate zone are no longer available. In this Application, Hydro One uses the same OEB approved methodology to derive the proposed 2027 RTSRs, as in previous IRM applications and most recently in the 2026 IRM application for the Orillia and Peterborough

RZs.³ As the 2020 rate year was the last year before the integration, the approved methodology to establish transmission charges applies the 2020 IESO billing information and billing quantities to the currently effective UTRs and Hydro One ST rates and losses. This approach will continue annually until all customers are fully transitioned to Hydro One's rate structure. The IRM Model allocates the resulting forecast transmission charges to the rate classes in proportion to the billed RTSR amount, which is based on current transmission rates and charge determinants from the 2020 RRR filing.

The current and proposed RTSRs for Orillia and Peterborough RZs are provided in Table 2 and Table 3, respectively.

GROUP 1 DEFERRAL AND VARIANCE ACCOUNT (DVA)

1.1 CONSOLIDATED GROUP 1 DVA BALANCE

Hydro One's consolidated Group 1 DVA balance as of December 31, 2025, adjusted for OEB approved dispositions in 2026, along with projected carrying charges up to the end of 2026 that are eligible for disposition in 2027 is a credit balance of \$213,145,059. The individual Group 1 Retail Service Variance Account (RSVA) balances for Hydro One Distribution, Orillia RZ and Peterborough RZ are established based on an allocation methodology described in Section 1.3.4 below.

Hydro One is not proposing to dispose of the balances in this proceeding. Hydro One requests that the OEB approve the deferral of disposition of its 2025 Group 1 DVA balances to Hydro One Distribution's 2028-2032 Custom IR application and to the Orillia and Peterborough Rate Zones' 2028 IRM application. Although the OEB's pre-set disposition threshold of \$0.001/kWh is exceeded for all rate zones, deferral is warranted to avoid the rate impacts that would result from implementing temporary credit riders in 2027 only to see rates rise upon expiry at the time of rebasing. Deferral maximizes regulatory efficiency by enabling the OEB to review and approve the Group 1 balances together with the Group 2 balances in a single comprehensive proceeding, consistent with the approach the OEB accepted in EB-2021-0032 and EB-2021-0033. Moreover, because the length of deferral is limited to one year and Group 1 balances continue to accrue carrying charges at the OEB-prescribed interest rate, customers are kept whole over the deferral period, and intergenerational equity concerns are minimized. This is further discussed in Section 1.6 of this exhibit.

Hydro One's Consolidated DVA Continuity Schedule is provided in Exhibit A-04-05, Attachment 1. Hydro One confirms that the Reporting and Record Keeping Requirements (RRR) data presented in Attachment 1 are accurate.

1.2 VARIANCES WITH CONSOLIDATED RRR 2.1.7 BALANCES

Hydro One submits RRR Group 1 balances on a consolidated basis only. As such, these consolidated balances for the service areas of Hydro One Distribution, Orillia RZ and Peterborough RZ will not match the balances allocated to Hydro One Distribution or other RZs individually. For a comparison of the RRR data and Hydro One's 2025 Group 1 DVA closing balances on a consolidated basis, please see Exhibit A-04-05, Attachment 1.

There are variances between the December 31, 2025 consolidated balances and RRR 2.1.7 data for the following two accounts: Account 1588 and Account 1589. These differences relate to the reversal of prior year RPP settlement true-up adjustments in the current year. The Consolidated Commodity Accounts Analysis Workbook has been completed and is provided in Exhibit A-04-06, Attachment 1.¹

1.3 ALLOCATION OF CONSOLIDATED GROUP 1 BALANCE

1.3.1 TRACKING AND ALLOCATION OF CONSOLIDATED GROUP 1 RSVA BALANCE

Hydro One tracks and records the Group 1 RSVA balance for Hydro One Distribution and its Acquired Utilities on a consolidated basis. This is because Hydro One receives one consolidated invoice from the Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO) for the settlement of commodity, bulk transmission and wholesale settlements for all of its service territories, including those of the Acquired Utilities. As a result, the RZ specific post-integration RSVA balances presented on the DVA continuity schedules have been determined using an approved allocation methodology.²

1 Orillia and Peterborough RZs are on a ten-year deferred rebasing period and their
2 distribution rates will not be harmonized with Hydro One until at least the end of their
3 deferred rebasing periods.³ As such, there remains a need to allocate the consolidated
4 RSVA balances between Hydro One Distribution, Orillia RZ, and Peterborough RZ to
5 determine the rate zone specific RSVA balances.

6 7 **1.3.2 DISPOSITION APPROACH FOR GROUP 1 BALANCE**

8 Under the methodology described in the OEB's Inspection Report dated March 4, 2019,
9 entitled "Inspection of Compliance of the RPP Settlement Process and Assessment of
10 DVA Allocation Methodology to Assign Group 1 Balances to the Acquired Utilities", Hydro
11 One uses the post-integration sales volume (kWh) of each of the utilities as the allocators
12 to assign the post-integration consolidated RSVA balances to each of Hydro One
13 Distribution, Orillia RZ and Peterborough RZ. The Inspection Report concluded that Hydro
14 One's Regulated Price Plan (RPP) settlement process complies with current regulatory
15 requirements and approved the allocation methodology for the post-integration RSVA
16 balances of the acquired utilities. The Inspection Report stated that:

17
18 HONI's proposed allocation methodology of using applicable sales volume
19 as the allocator for Group 1 Accounts 1588 and 1589 balances for
20 Haldimand County Hydro, Norfolk Power and Woodstock Hydro is
21 reasonable.⁴
22

23 Based on the Inspection Report, the OEB accepted that the Group 1 allocation
24 methodology results in the same rate riders whether the balances are allocated to all
25 utilities separately or as one single entity.⁵

1 In the Decision and Rate Order in EB-2019-0044, the OEB accepted Hydro One's
2 disposition approach to establish the total balance and seek approval to dispose of the
3 accounts for Hydro One Distribution and all other acquired utilities in the same year.⁶

4
5 This disposition approach has subsequently been accepted by the OEB in multiple
6 proceedings, including the following:

- 7 • Approval to dispose of the Group 1 balances as of December 31, 2019 for Hydro
8 One Distribution and Norfolk, Haldimand and Woodstock RZs in 2021 rates, as
9 noted in the Decision and Order for Hydro One and Norfolk, Haldimand and
10 Woodstock RZ's 2021 rates.⁷
- 11 • Approval to defer Group 1 account disposition as of December 31, 2020 for
12 Norfolk, Haldimand and Woodstock RZs to the 2023 Custom IR Annual Update
13 Application to facilitate review and disposition of all consolidated balances at the
14 same time.⁸
- 15 • Approval to defer the disposition of 2021 Group 1 balances for Orillia and
16 Peterborough RZs to the 2024 Application to facilitate the review and disposition
17 of all 2021 Group 1 balances as part of the 2024 proceeding.⁹
- 18 • Approval to dispose of the Group 1 balances as of December 31, 2022, for Hydro
19 One Distribution and the Acquired Utilities in 2024 rates, as noted in the Decision
20 and Order for Hydro One and the Acquired Utilities' 2024 rates.¹⁰

- 1 • Approval to dispose of the Group 1 balances, on an interim basis, as of December
2 31, 2023, for Hydro One Distribution and the Acquired Utilities in 2025 rates,
3 except for the balances in Account 1588, 1589 and 1595 (2021).¹¹
- 4 • Approval to dispose of the Group 1 balances, on a final basis, as of December 31,
5 2024, for Hydro One Consolidated in 2026 rates except the 2023 and 2024
6 Account 1588 and 1589 balances, which were approved on an interim basis. In the
7 2026 rates proceeding, the OEB also approved on a final basis December 31, 2023
8 balances, and the Account 1595 (2021) balance, which were previously disposed
9 on an interim basis in the 2025 rates proceedings.¹²

11 **1.3.3 LV VARIANCE ACCOUNT CONSOLIDATED BALANCE**

12 Post integration, the principal transactions in the LV variance account are directly
13 attributed to Hydro One Distribution. This is due to the fact that post integration, OPDC
14 and PDI are no longer considered embedded LDCs and their LV variances are no longer
15 tracked in the LV Variance Account, consistent with the approval in the Orillia and
16 Peterborough RZ's last three IRM Applications (EB-2023-0059, EB-2024-0033, and EB-
17 2025-0030).

19 **1.3.4 GROUP 1 DVA BALANCE ALLOCATIONS**

20 Table 1 below presents the total Group 1 DVA balances by rate zone as at December 31,
21 2025, adjusted for OEB approved dispositions in 2026, along with projected carrying
22 charges to up the end of 2026 that are eligible for disposition in 2027. The allocation of
23 the consolidated Group 1 balances to Hydro One Distribution, Orillia RZ and Peterborough
24 RZ is consistent with the approved Group 1 allocation methodology.¹³

The OEB pre-set disposition threshold of \$0.001 per kWh has been exceeded for Hydro One Distribution, Orillia RZ and Peterborough RZ.

1.4 HYDRO ONE DISTRIBUTION GROUP 1 DVA BALANCE

In its 2026 Custom IR Annual Update application, the OEB approved the disposition of Group 1 DVA balances as of December 31, 2024 for Hydro One (including Orillia and Peterborough RZs), including interest projected to December 31, 2025 for Group 1 accounts on a final basis (excluding Accounts 1588 and 1589). The 2023 and 2024 balances related to Accounts 1588 and 1589 were approved on an interim basis. The OEB also approved on a final basis the December 31, 2023 balances that were previously disposed of on an interim basis in Hydro One's 2025 rates proceedings.

In this Application, the December 31, 2025 Group 1 DVA balance for Hydro One Distribution, for which Hydro One proposes to defer disposition to the 2028-2032 Custom IR application, is a credit balance of \$204,723,753.¹⁵

Hydro One confirms it has not adjusted the Group 1 account balances that were previously approved by the OEB for disposition on a final basis.

In its 2026 Custom IR Annual Update application, the OEB approved the disposition of

Group 1 DVA balances as of December 31, 2024 for Hydro One (including Orillia and

Peterborough), including interest projected to December 31, 2025 for Group 1 accounts

on a final basis (excluding Accounts 1588 and 1589). The 2023 and 2024 balances related

1 to Accounts 1588 and 1589 were approved on an interim basis. The OEB also approved
2 on a final basis the December 31, 2023 balances that were previously disposed of on an
3 interim basis in Hydro One's 2025 rates proceedings.

4
5 In this Application, the December 31, 2025 Group 1 DVA balances for Orillia RZ and
6 Peterborough RZ, for which Hydro One proposes to defer disposition to their 2028 IRM
7 Application are:¹⁸

- 8 • a credit balance of \$3,426,329 for Orillia RZ;¹⁹ and
- 9 • a credit balance of \$4,994,978 for Peterborough RZ.

10
11 Hydro One confirms it has not adjusted the Group 1 account balances that were previously
12 approved by the OEB for disposition on a final basis.

13
14 The Group 1 DVA continuity schedules for Orillia RZ and Peterborough RZ are provided
15 in the OEB's IRM Rate Generator (IRM Model) (Tab 3. Continuity Schedule), which are
16 filed in Exhibit A-04-05, Attachments 4 and 5, respectively.

17
18 The Group 1 DVA balances for Orillia RZ and Peterborough RZ are summarized in Tables
19 5 and 6 below.

1.6 GROUP 1 DVA DEFERRAL RATIONALE

Hydro One acknowledges that the aggregate Group 1 balance as of December 31, 2025 (including interest to December 31, 2026) is a credit of \$213,145,059, exceeding the OEB's pre-set disposition threshold of \$0.001/kWh. Despite the consolidated Group 1 balance exceeding the OEB's disposition threshold, Hydro One is proposing to defer (i) disposition for the 2025 Hydro One Distribution Group 1 balances to its 2028-2032 Custom IR application; and (ii) disposition of 2025 Orillia RZ and Peterborough RZ balances to their 2028 IRM application for the reasons set out below:

Basis for Group 1 DVA Deferral - Hydro One Distribution

- Disposing of the 2025 Group 1 credit balance in this Application would result in credit riders that temporarily lower customer rates in 2027. Upon expiry of these riders on January 1, 2028, customers would experience a corresponding increase in rates, coinciding with rate changes arising from Hydro One's 2028-2032 Custom IR application. Deferring disposition of the 2025 Group 1 credit balance to 2028 would support greater rate stability by smoothing year-over-year changes in customer rates and aligning the disposition with the 2028-2032 Custom IR process.
- Deferral of the Group 1 disposition to Hydro One's 2028-2032 Custom IR application will maximize regulatory efficiency by consolidating the review of all DVA balances within a single proceeding. As the 2028-2032 Custom IR application is planned to be submitted to the OEB in Fall 2026, there will be no new information available at the time of its submission regarding Group 1 DVA balances. Accordingly, a separate review of the Group 1 balances in this proceeding would provide limited incremental value. Deferral also allows the Group 1 and Group 2 balances to be reviewed together, enabling the OEB to consider all of Hydro One's accounts in a single comprehensive review.²⁴

- As the length of deferral is only one year, it minimizes the potential for any intergenerational equity concerns.
- Customers are kept whole over the deferral period, as Group 1 balances continue to accrue carrying charges at the OEB-prescribed interest rate.
- Given the parallel proceeding in the 2028-2032 Custom IR application, disposing of the 2025 balance in this proceeding will cause resource and timing constraints related to the implementation of new rate riders and changes to the system.

Basis for Group 1 DVA Deferral - Orillia RZ and Peterborough RZ

- The OEB approved the deferral of Group 1 balance disposition for Norfolk Power, Haldimand County Hydro, and Woodstock Hydro in EB-2021-0032/EB-2021-0033, such that they would be disposed at the same time as the broader Hydro One Networks' balances.
- It is appropriate in this circumstance for the Orillia and Peterborough RZ's Group 1 balances to be deferred to their 2028 IRM application, in alignment with Hydro One Networks' Group 1 balances, such that the 2025 balances are disposed in the same year, concurrent with the disposition of the 2025 Distribution Group 1 balances in its 2028-2032 Custom IR application. This would be consistent with the OEB's approach to approve overall balance, the allocation and disposition of the individual balances all at the same time.

Summary

Beyond the entity-specific rationale above, disposing of the 2025 balances for Hydro One Distribution, Orillia RZ and Peterborough RZ in the 2028 rate proceedings will allow the OEB to approve all of the balances on a consolidated basis, together with the allocation. This maximizes regulatory efficiency and allows all impacts to be reviewed together, consistent with the approach accepted by the OEB in the past.

ACCOUNTS 1588 – RSVA POWER AND 1589 – RSVA GLOBAL ADJUSTMENT

1.1 ACCOUNTS 1588 – RSVA POWER AND 1589 – RSVA GLOBAL ADJUSTMENT

On February 21, 2019, the OEB issued a new Accounting Guidance related to Accounts 1588 RSVA Power and 1589 RSVA Global Adjustment (GA). The new Accounting Guidance is effective January 1, 2019 and was to be implemented by August 31, 2019.

In the 2021 Decision and Rate Order for Hydro One Distribution, the OEB approved Hydro One's proposal to adopt the new Accounting Guidance in a modified manner until the OEB otherwise directs Hydro One.¹

In the 2024 Partial Decision and Rate Orders for Hydro One Distribution, and for the Orillia and Peterborough RZs, the OEB ordered Hydro One to fully adopt the Accounting Guidance on a prospective basis, and ordered Hydro One to present a plan with costs and implications of fully adopting the OEB's Accounting Guidance on a prospective basis no later than its next Custom IR application.² The OEB stated that this plan should encompass all of Hydro One's service territories, including Orillia and Peterborough RZs. Hydro One confirmed its plans to present a plan to the OEB no later than the 2028 Custom IR application to fully adopt the Accounting Guidance.³

In the 2025 Decision and Order for Hydro One Distribution, the OEB did not approve the disposition of Accounts 1588 and 1589 as of December 31, 2023 due to the concerns expressed in its decision.⁴

1 Pursuant to EB-2024-0032, the OEB directed that:

- 2 (i) An internal review be performed on Accounts 1588, 1589 and 1595 (2021) for
3 all three rate zones, namely for Hydro One Distribution, and Orillia and
4 Peterborough RZs, and;
5 (ii) Hydro One and OEB staff meet prior to the filing of the 2026 rate application to
6 reach an agreement on the balances to be included for disposition.⁵

7
8 On August 15, 2025, Hydro One and OEB staff met to discuss the Accounts 1588, 1589
9 and 1595 (2021) balances.

10
11 On August 27, 2025, Hydro One and OEB staff jointly prepared a report on the account
12 balances pursuant to the Decision and Order in EB-2024-0032 (Hydro One Networks Inc./
13 OEB Staff Report on Account Balances for Accounts 1588, 1589 and 1595 (2021)
14 Pursuant to the OEB's Decision and Order in EB-2024-0032). The report is filed in EB-
15 2025-0030, Exhibit A-04-06, Attachment 2. Below is a summary of the agreement:

- 16
17 • Hydro One and OEB staff have agreed on the disposition of the balance in Account
18 1595 (2021) on a final basis.
19
20 • There is no agreement at this time on the 2023 balances for Accounts 1588 and
21 1589, however, OEB staff will support disposition of the 2023 balances for
22 Accounts 1588 and 1589 on an interim basis in the event that the OEB is not
23 prepared to dispose of the balances on a final basis as part of its decision on Hydro
24 One's 2026 rate application.
25
26 • With regard to Account 1588, since the Account 1588 and 1589 balances are
27 typically reviewed together, and given the interconnectivity of these accounts,
28 there was also no agreement on final disposition of the 2023 balance in Account
29 1588.

- Hydro One agreed to file, on a best efforts basis, a modified Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform (customized to Hydro One's circumstances) during the 2026 proceeding to support the reasonability of the Account 1589 balance. There is no agreement at this time that the modified Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform will establish reasonability.

In the 2026 Annual Update proceeding (EB-2025-0030), Hydro One made best efforts to produce a modified Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform, but it was unable to submit a modified Workform as the verification and reviews were not complete within the timeframes of that proceeding.

In the OEB's Partial Decision and Order for EB-2025-0030, the OEB approved disposition of the 2023 and 2024 balances related to Accounts 1588 and 1589 on an interim basis to mitigate the intergenerational equity impacts. The OEB directed Hydro One to file the modified Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform (Workform) with a breakdown of separate reconciling items for any billing adjustments, IESO settlement adjustments, or other adjustments,⁶ and ensure data verification on a best efforts basis.

1.2 COMMODITY ACCOUNTS ANALYSIS WORKFORM

In accordance with the Chapter 3 Filing Requirements, and pursuant to the OEB's 2024 Decision and Rate Order (EB-2023-0030 and EB-2023-0059), Hydro One was approved to file a Consolidated GA Analysis Workform (now, the Consolidated Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform) for all of its RZs. Hydro One receives one consolidated invoice from the settlement of commodity, bulk transmission and wholesale settlements for all its service territories from the Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO).⁷ As such, the reasonability test for Accounts 1588 and 1589 is determined on a consolidated basis.

1 The consolidated 2022 Account 1588 and 1589 balances for Hydro One Distribution were
2 last approved for disposition, on a final basis, in the 2024 Annual Update proceeding (EB-
3 2023-0030).

5 **1.2.1 ACCOUNT 1589 REASONABILITY**

6 The 2023, 2024 and 2025 Account 1589 balances are below 1% of the total annual IESO
7 GA charges, taking into consideration the reconciling adjustments that are noted in the
8 Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform.

9
10 Hydro One has identified reconciling adjustments in the Commodity Accounts Analysis
11 Workform (Exhibit A-04-06, Attachment 1) to explain the net change in the principal
12 balance in the general ledger. Reconciliations are required in Note 5 of the Commodity
13 Accounts Analysis Workform to true-up the Workform's estimate. In this context, the
14 comparison between expected GA revenue and actual GA revenue billed results in a
15 variance that was identified as a reconciling item. Specifically, any reconciling items
16 recorded as a debit adjustment to the RSVA balance represents an over-recovery of GA
17 revenue (or regulatory asset) relative to the Workform's expectations. A credit adjustment
18 to the RSVA balance represents an under-recovery of GA revenue (or regulatory liability)
19 relative to the Workform's expectations.

21 **1.2.2 ACCOUNT 1588 REASONABILITY**

22 The 2023 Account 1588 balance as a percentage of Account 4705 is -1.9%. After including
23 the reconciling item of \$41,214,479 to reflect the variance between commodity costs
24 based on actual line losses and revenues calculated using approved line losses, the
25 variance has been reduced to -0.2%, calculated as the sum of 2023 transactions, principal
26 adjustments and reconciling items divided by the Account 4705 Power Purchased amount.

27
28 The 2024 Account 1588 balance as a percentage of Account 4705 is -1.5%. Similar to the
29 above, after including the reconciling item of \$24,429,199 to reflect the variance between
30 commodity costs based on actual line losses and revenues calculated using approved line
31 losses, the variance has been reduced to -0.5%, calculated as the sum of 2024

1 transactions, principal adjustments and reconciling items divided by the Account 4705
2 Power Purchased amount.

3
4 The 2025 Account 1588 balance as a percentage of Account 4705 is -0.3%. Similar to the
5 above, this includes the reconciling item of \$30,119,025 to reflect the variance between
6 commodity costs based on actual line losses and revenues calculated using approved line
7 losses.

8

10 11 **1.2.3 COMMODITY ACCOUNTS WORKFORM UPDATE**

12 In the EB-2025-0030 Decision, the OEB approved disposition of the 2023 and 2024
13 balances related to Accounts 1588 and 1589 on an interim basis and directed Hydro One
14 to file the modified Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform with breakdown of separate
15 reconciling items for any billing adjustments, IESO settlement adjustments, or other
16 adjustments.

17
18 In this proceeding, the Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform has been modified to
19 include a calendarization of the Global Adjustment (GA) revenue schedule and a
20 reconciliation to general ledger (GL) records, illustrating how actual accounting practices
21 differ from the OEB's Workform Note 4-based estimated revenue. This reconciliation is
22 provided in Tabs "GA 2023 Item 10", "GA 2024 Item 8" and "GA 2025 Item 8". This
23 additional disclosure is not intended to reconcile to the estimated GA revenue in Note 4,
24 but rather to demonstrate that the estimation methodology applied in the Workform is an
25 over-simplification of the Hydro One's calculation of its GA revenue, given that the actual
26 revenue recorded in the GL reflects more complex billing activities.

27
28 The calendarization GA schedule provides an illustrative example of the level of detail
29 required to accurately align consumption with the applicable GA rates. In addition, a
30 summary analysis is provided to highlight the key differences between (i) accounting and
31 billing practices and (ii) the Workform Note 4 calculation.

1 There are two main differences between Hydro One's GA accounting practice and the
2 calculation methodology in Workform Note 4.

3
4 **1. Treatment of reversal of unbilled revenue:** Hydro One Distribution reverses unbilled
5 revenue in the subsequent period. As a result, only year-end unbilled revenue remains
6 in the general ledger (GL), since monthly unbilled accruals are reversed in the
7 following month and therefore have no net impact on annual revenue. By contrast, the
8 Workform reverses the same unbilled consumption volumes using the subsequent
9 month's GA rate rather than the original rate applied when the accrual was recorded.
10 This can cause the reversal amount to differ from the original accrual, resulting in a
11 variance between Note 4 estimated and actual recognized revenue in the GL.

12
13 **2. GA Revenue Calculation:** GA revenue is calculated at the individual customer
14 account level using actual consumption for each billing cycle, which may not align with
15 the calendar month. This includes both billed and unbilled volumes and applies the
16 monthly GA rate in effect when the consumption occurs. This approach preserves the
17 link between each unit of consumption and the corresponding monthly GA rate. By
18 contrast, the OEB's generic Workform applies a single monthly GA rate to aggregated
19 total consumption, including both billed and unbilled volumes. Because this method
20 does not distinguish consumption by billing period or by customer, it reduces
21 granularity and may result in a mismatch between the GA rate applied and the period
22 in which the consumption occurred.

23
24 In 2023, 2024, and 2025, there are credit reconciling items of \$25,995,070 (Note 5, Item
25 10), \$13,507,383 (Note 5, Item 8), and \$12,721,376 (Note 5, Item 8), respectively. Due to
26 the differences in the GA revenue calculation, these amounts reflect Hydro One-specific
27 adjustments to the OEB's Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform (Note 4 table).

28
29 In summary, this reconciling item arises because the OEB's Note 4 table applies a single
30 monthly Global Adjustment (GA) rate (the first estimate) to total aggregated consumption
31 volumes, including both billed and unbilled consumption. As this methodology does not

1 differentiate consumption by billing period or customer, it does not provide the granularity
2 necessary to ensure that the applicable monthly GA rate is matched to the period in which
3 the consumption occurred. Consequently, differences may arise between the GA
4 revenues calculated in the Workform and those recorded by Hydro One.

5
6 To supplement this approach, Hydro One has modified the Commodity Accounts Analysis
7 Workform by performing a calendarized calculation of GA revenue at the individual
8 customer account level. This calculation uses actual consumption for each billing cycle,
9 including both billed and unbilled volumes, and applies the monthly GA rate in effect during
10 the period in which the consumption occurred. This approach preserves the direct
11 relationship between each unit of consumption and its corresponding monthly GA rate,
12 resulting in a more precise calculation of GA revenues.

13
14 The resulting adjustment is reflected in Hydro One's general ledger; however, it is
15 excluded from the comparison to the OEB's Note 4 table in order to facilitate a like-for-like
16 comparison with the Workform methodology.

17
18 In the Partial Decision and Order for EB-2025-0030, OEB Staff noted that it was not
19 appropriate for Hydro One to rely on aggregate "plug" reconciling items (i.e., reconciling
20 total Account 1588 and 1589 transactions recorded in the general ledger to the balances
21 produced by the Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform). OEB Staff submitted that
22 discrete reconciling items should instead be identified and quantified, with sufficient
23 supporting detail to demonstrate the reasonableness of the Account 1588 and 1589
24 balances for final disposition.

25
26 In the prior proceeding, Hydro One was unable to obtain the calendarized meter data
27 necessary to perform a more detailed analysis of GA revenues. In preparation for this
28 Application filing, Hydro One reviewed and validated the approach to calendarize GA
29 revenues for Class B customers. The amount reported in the Workform GA Tabs, Note 5,
30 Item 10 (2023) and Item 8 (2024, 2025) represent a discrete and supportable reconciling
31 item that quantifies the difference between the OEB Workform methodology and Hydro

1 One's calendarized customer-level calculation of GA revenues, rather than a residual
2 "plug" adjustment.

3
4 Hydro One intends to present a plan in its upcoming 2028-2032 Custom IR application to
5 calendarize its commodity revenue and line loss-adjusted retail sales volumes for its
6 distribution customer accounts to align with the accounting guidance established by the
7 OEB in its EB-2023-0030/EB-2023-0059 decision. Hydro One will disclose the related
8 commodity revenue adjustments associated with billing activities once the calendarization
9 results are available.

10
11 Moreover, in accordance with the OEB's direction, based on the results of the GA revenue
12 calendarization, Hydro One Distribution did not identify any significant billing adjustments
13 to be disclosed in sections 3(a) and 3(b) of the Note 5 table in the Commodity Accounts
14 Analysis Workform. Specifically, no adjustments exceeded the reporting thresholds of
15 \$0.5M or 1% of "\$ Consumption at Actual Rate Paid" as reported in Note 4, item M.

16
17 All other adjustments, including those related to IESO settlements and invoice true-ups,
18 have been captured and disclosed in the Workform under the relevant sections of Note 5
19 and Note 7(a).

**DISPOSITION OF LOST REVENUE ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM
(LRAM) ELIGIBLE AMOUNTS**

Orillia and Peterborough RZs

Hydro One is seeking disposition of the 2027 LRAM-Eligible amounts for the Orillia and Peterborough RZs related to the lost revenues from the former Conservation First Framework (CFF) that was approved in the Decision and Order for 2023 rates (EB-2022-0040).

In the EB-2022-0040 decision for 2023 distribution rates, the OEB approved the disposition of the LRAM variance account (LRAMVA), such that the balances in the LRAMVA are now zero for the Orillia and Peterborough RZs. The OEB also approved the base LRAM-Eligible amounts for the 2023-2029 years for prospective disposition, including the recovery of the 2027 LRAM-Eligible amounts in this Application.¹

Consistent with the OEB's LRAMVA Guidance on Prospective Lost Revenues dated June 16, 2023, the 2027 LRAM-Eligible amounts for each rate zone have been escalated by the OEB-approved inflation factor for 2027 rates and will be recovered over a 1-year period. The 2027 calculations for the escalated LRAM-Eligible amounts are provided for Orillia and Peterborough RZ in Tables 1 and 2 below.

BILL IMPACTS

Hydro One Distribution

A summary of the 2027 total bill impacts for Hydro One Distribution as a result of the proposed 2027 distribution rates relative to the approved 2026 distribution rates is presented in Table 1.

The detailed calculation of Hydro One Distribution's 2027 monthly bill impacts by rate class is provided in Exhibit A-06-01, Attachment 1. As per the Decision and Order in EB-2021-0110, Hydro One will continue to apply mitigation credit to the affected acquired unmetered customers in Norfolk, Haldimand and Woodstock service areas to limit their bill impacts to no more than 10%.

Although the total bill impact for the Seasonal-R2 customers is slightly over 10%, one of the main drivers for this impact is the expiry of credit riders that are currently in place.¹ Hydro One notes that these customers are already receiving bill mitigation under the 10-year phase-in plan as approved by the OEB in EB-2020-0246 and is not proposing further mitigation solely on the basis of the impacts resulting from the expiry of credit riders.

¹ In 2026, these credit riders resulted in bill impacts that were well below 10%.

RESIDENTIAL SERVICE CLASSIFICATIONS - HYDRO ONE NETWORKS INC. SERVICE AREA

These classifications apply to year-round and seasonal residential properties. A year-round residential property, located in Hydro One Networks Inc.'s service area excluding former Norfolk Power Distribution Inc., Haldimand County Hydro Inc. and Woodstock Hydro Services Inc.'s service areas., is considered to be customer's main place of abode and may include additional buildings served through the same meter, provided they are not rental income units. All of the following criteria must be met:

1. Occupant represents and warrants to Hydro One Networks Inc. that for so long as he/she has year-round residential rate status for the identified dwelling, he/she will not designate another property that he/she owns as a year-round residence for purposes of Hydro One rate classification.
2. Occupier must live in this residence for at least four (4) days of the week for eight (8) months of the year and the Occupier must not reside anywhere else for more than three (3) days a week during eight (8) months of the year.
3. The address of this residence must appear on documents such as the occupant's electric bill, driver's licence, credit card invoice, property tax bill, etc.
4. Occupants who are eligible to vote in Provincial or Federal elections must be enumerated for this purpose at the address of this residence.

A seasonal property is defined as any residential service that does not meet residential year-round criteria. It includes dwellings such as cottages, chalets and camps.

Class B consumers are defined in accordance with O. Reg. 429/04. Further servicing details are available in the distributor's conditions of Service.

APPLICATION

Hydro One Networks' residential service area is sub-divided into three density zones according to the following:

- Urban Density Zone is defined as areas containing 3,000 or more customers with a line density of at least 60 customers per circuit kilometer.
- Medium Density Zone is defined as areas containing 100 or more customers with a line density of at least 15 customers per circuit kilometer.
- Low Density Zone is defined as areas other than Urban or Medium Density Zone.

The application of these rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Ontario Energy Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Ontario Energy Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

No rates and charges for the distribution of electricity and charges to meet the costs of any work or service done or furnished for the purpose of the distribution of electricity shall be made except as permitted by this schedule, unless required by the Distributor's Licence or a Code or Order of the Ontario Energy Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Ontario Energy Board, or as specified herein.

Unless specifically noted, this schedule does not contain any charges for the electricity commodity, be it under the Regulated Price Plan, a contract with a retailer or the wholesale market price, as applicable. In addition, the charges in the MONTHLY RATES AND CHARGES - Regulatory Component of this schedule do not apply to a customer that is an embedded wholesale market participant.

It should be noted that this schedule does not list any charges, assessments or credits that are required by law to be invoiced by a distributor and that are not subject to Ontario Energy Board approval, such as the Global Adjustment and the HST.
