



We want to hear your feedback about the Waasigan Transmission Line

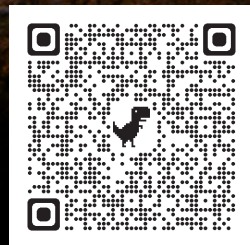
Northwestern Ontario is growing and needs access to more electricity. Hydro One wants to support this growth and energize life for communities and businesses in the region.

Indigenous Community Values



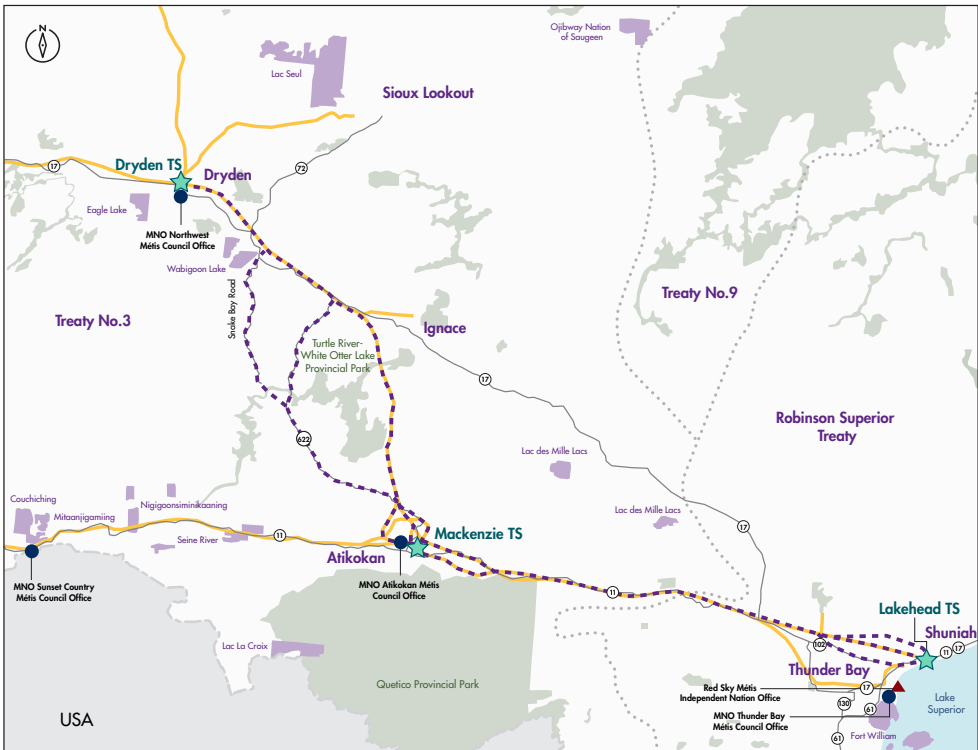
Socio-Economic Environment

- Field surveys are being completed across the project study area to collect data that will help us evaluate the alternative routes and identify and assess potential project-related environmental effects.
- In May, we offered in-person and virtual engagement opportunities to collect feedback on the alternative routes and evaluation criteria.
